Water temperatures are in the mid 70's and air temperatures range from 50 to low 70's.

Scott Mundell

Scott L. Mundell, age 32 passed away September 29, 2002 to his ongoing battle with brain cancer.

Born in Hockessin, Delaware, Scott graduated from Alexis I. Dupont High School in 1988. Scott led the team to two state championships and four conference titles. He capped his senior year with three gold medals and four meet records. Scott set records in the 50 Free, the 100 Butterfly, and as a member of the 400 Freestyle Relay Team. Scott was awarded a scholarship to Florida State University where he was an All-American Swimmer. After high school, Scott’s love for swimming and the ocean led him to work as a lifeguard in New Jersey, Florida, California, and Hawaii. In 1996, while working for Delray Beach Ocean Rescue, Scott won Gold Medals in the 500 Meter Open Swim, and the Line Pull during the USLA National Lifeguard Championships in Daytona. In 1996, Scott was picked as a member for Team Florida (a six person lifeguard team) to compete in Hawaii at the Oahu World Life-Saving Championships. Scott brought his team from fifth place during the Swim Relay, to a First Place finish by passing other top ranked swimmers from around the world. Scott served as a lifeguard on a half dozen beach patrols, saving lives, winning races, and making lifelong friends. Scott counted among his greatest honors during his short life that he was asked to be “Best Man” in six weddings. Every once in a while a person moves you, touches you, and turns you around. Scott was one of these people. He had the heart of a swimmer and the soul of a gypsy, and if he was here today he just might be the first guy out of the water.
